# Fireside Chat with Minister Tan See Leng

The Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SICCI) held its first fireside chat for 2022 and its first major event following the relaxation of safe management measures.

Joining the dialogue on 1 April 2022 was Minister for Manpower and Second Minister for Trade and Industry Dr Tan See Leng.

The fireside chat was attended by business leaders, diplomats and young entrepreneurs from the indian business community. It was a timely discussion with Minister Tan, after Budget 2022 and with the Ukraine conflict looming in the world.

The impact of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and the aftershock was one subject very much in the minds of the participants.

Writing on his Facebook page, Minister Tan said, "Happy to have the opportunity to chat with about 100 members from Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce & Industry (SICCI). We had a good and candid discussion on a variety of issues, including Singapore's foreign manpower policies, energy prices and the need to decarbonise. SICCI is a close partner. They play a crucial role in working with the Government to support business growth and highlight the challenges that our SMEs face. The Government remains committed to strengthening the resilience of our economy, supporting businesses and creating good jobs for workers. Together with trade associations and chambers like SICCI, we will continue to help businesses innovate, improve their productivity and position themselves for growth".

In his opening address at the Fireside Chat, Dr Chandroo spoke extensively about the impact of the Ukraine crisis and the concerns of businesses in Singapore. We bring you Dr Chandroo's speech at the event:

Honourable Minister for Manpower and Second Minister for Trade and Industry, Dr Tan See Leng, Fireside Chat moderator Mr Vikram Khanna - Associate Editor at the Straits Times, Fellow leaders from our Federation of Singapore Indian Organizations, Ladies and Gentlemen here in person at the auditorium and on the zoom platform

I am very pleased to welcome all of you to the first fireside chat for 2022 organised regularly by SICCI with our government leaders. We are most grateful to Minister Dr Tan See Leng for consenting to join us for this session and to share his perspectives on a wide range of issues facing this country and I am sure we are all ready with the help of our moderator Vikram Khanna to engage Dr Tan on these subject matters.

I must say that coming from the private sector and that too from the healthcare sector where manpower is a major challenge, Dr Tan is someone who has felt the pulse and urgent needs and concerns of the private sector companies in the formulation of policies and thinking on manpower, education, lifelong learning and education issues.

Allow me to set the brief context before I handover the floor and stage to the honourable minister.

Looks like dealing and swallowing bitter medicine from one global pandemic hitting all of us for almost two years was not enough for all of us citizens. Now we are all faced with the aftermath of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and this is not just an economic fallout but a deeper and more critical issue of big states and small states.

SICCI fully supports the stand of the government which has been emphasised at the international stage at the United Nations and through the statements of our Prime Minister, Foreign Affairs Minister and other leaders following Russia's invasion of Ukraine. In fact Singapore's strong stand is a talking point among world leaders from the media reports we read and so it's no surprise that this little red dot and chilli padi will punch above its weight and makes its global stand clear on these issues when the need arises.

Meanwhile the economic fallout from this episode is biting us quite badly now. We feel it in the petrol prices that we have to pay, the electricity bills that we have to settle both at home and in our office.

SICCI's members who have business dealings in Russia and also in Ukraine are feeling the heat and I am sure those who are present here at this forum will be able to share with you and all of us of the first-hand impact that they have faced and steps they have taken to mitigate the fallout.

Your cabinet colleague, Finance Minister Lawrence Wong has given several assurances that the government stands ready to roll out schemes to mitigate the fallout if the need arises and we are heartened by this assurance from the Singapore government.

We can talk about this more during our dialogue session.

Let me now turn to Budget 2022, another topic for our fireside chat today.

In any Budget statement by the Finance Minister, there will always be announcements which are sweet for businesses and individuals and some others which are not so sweet and a bit sour.

For us at SICCI, we are heartened with the decision to defer the GST increase till 2023, something which we had requested in our wishlist to the Finance Minister. But I do have a question for the Minister. Will the ongoing Ukraine crisis now have a bearing on the government's intention to raise the GST rate on 1 January 2023. Do we see the government proceeding as announced? We look forward to hear the Minister on this matter.

Manpower is always close to the hearts of Indian businesses, especially manpower and workers from the Indian sub-continent.

Indian businesses were badly hit at the height of the circuit breaker in 2020 and the phased return of workers entering Singapore from overseas for the key sectors.

However, we are pleased that the government is now approving the work permits and other work passes for the various categories and more workers are returning to some of these sectors. However some sectors are still in urgent need of workers, among them the food and beverage industry and restaurants sector who are unable to find local workers to be cooks and kitchen assistants. It is rather sad some big names in the Indian food market have had to close and scale down their operations as a result of this. We would be happy to hear from the Manpower Minister, going forward what would be his Ministry's stand in allowing foreign workers for sectors like food and beverage something which both we at SICCI and the Little India Shopkeepers and Heritage Association (LISHA) have been requesting.

I am sure many of you in the audience have many burning questions to ask the Minister and with these introductory remarks, I now invite Minister Dr Tan See Leng to make his remarks and handover the dialogue to the moderator.

Thank you very much and let us have a fruitful session.

# **Tapping Into India's Markets**

After two years of sluggish business and growth , international borders are finally opening up and there is no better time to once again revive that business fever post-pandemic.

And what better time than now to invest in one the world's largest emerging markets- India. That's what participants at a recent webinar organised by the Singapore Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SICCI) together with Enterprise Singapore and the DBS SME Centre.

The topic was Cross Border Trade Opportunities in India.

# **Opportunities in India**

In his opening address to the session on 23 March 2022, SICCI Chairman, Dr T Chandroo noted that Singapore and India are two countries always talking about doing things together and for the benefit of not only the peoples and businesses of both countries but the global community at large.

According to figures released by the Singapore Trade and Industry Ministry, our total bilateral trade in goods increased by approximately 35% last year to S\$26.8 billion, from S\$19.8 billion in 2020. And Singapore's leaders have been exploring areas of business ties for Singapore and India to expand upon. Three areas have been highlighted recently, noted Dr Chandroo.

The first is what is called deeptech. Here, Artificial Intelligence and the Internet of Things (or IoT) hold much potential in a wide range of areas. This includes the construction and built environment sector, to build smarter and more sustainable cities.

Second is cleantech. Both our countries have announced ambitious carbon mitigation plans. R&D advancements in this domain could have a profound impact on greening the power and transportation sectors, particularly aviation and maritime transport.

The third area is genome and bio-informatics research. And amongst the Indian business community in Singapore, we have many companies both large and small who are experts in these areas and who are more than ready to enter joint s ventures with suitable business partners from India. This is where our SME Centre at SICCI has a big role to play.

#### The Role of SME@SICCI

The webinar session also got a deeper insight of the role of the SME Centre at SICCI.

Its Director, Mr Paul Chong says SMEs in Singapore can tap the expertise of its business advisors to start on their internationalisation journey. This includes exploring market resources and partners to kick-off their expansion journey and addressing some of the common challenges that starters would face while embarking on their overseas ventures.

Mr Chong emphasised that the consultancy services provided by the advisors is complimentary.

As we refresh our ITMs I look forward to SCCCI and our TACs playing an even bigger role in enabling economic transformation. " he added.

From all of us at SICCI- we say welcome onboard!





# Helping Ukrainians - let's play our part.



Following rapidly-growing displacement, the situation in Ukraine is fast becoming one of world's biggest humanitarian crises.
