Kamala Club Singapore



Established in 1950, The Kamala club today is 72 years young with membership size of 150 families .

In the early 20th century, Indians from all walks of life, laborer's and professionals like doctors, lawyers, and businessmen, migrated to Singapore to start a new life. To pass free time, the

spouses of these migrants started meeting for coffee mornings and for activities and events. This led to formation of two ladies groups viz. The Ladies Union and the Lotus Club.

After India's Independence, PM Jawaharlal Nehru came to visit Singapore and he was hosted by these two ladies groups. He suggested that they should get together and form one club and name it after his late wife Kamala. The Lotus was kept as the logo and The Kamala Club was officially formed in 1950.

Singapore Malayalee Association



SMA celebrated its centenary in 2017 with a Gala Dinner at Marina Bay Sands with Prime Minister Mr. Lee Hsien Loong, as the Guest of Honor..

SMA set up the Singapore Malayalee Bursary of S\$1million for needy students at the National University of Singapore.

SMA together with other Indian organizations helped raise funds in aid of Kerala Flood Victims in 2018 and also for Kerala Covid Relief in 2020.

SMA organized a cultural dance event called Mega Thiruvathira that made it to the Singapore Book of Records in terms of a maximum number of participants (500) in a dance event.

Since then, the number of family members have increased to approximately 350 families.

Mandal is honoured to be a member of the FSIO which has opened doors for new opportunities for the members of the Mandal who can look forward to tap resources which will help them in developing their businesses and get professional advice as and when required. At the same time, members will have opportunities to integrate with other societies and their members on a larger platform on various occasions.


